The General Election on 12 December, for truthful and respectful debate and for all who work to ensure this is a fair process. Give thanks that we are able to have a free choice as to who we vote for.


For good relationships between different denominations and religions, as we focus on the peace that Jesus brings.

Mission Focus - Alternatives Trust



Listen - Care - Support Holistic Help in a Hurting World

For many years we have supported Alternatives Trust East London, which started in 1994 and is based in the London Borough of Newham.

Its charitable objectives are the physical and mental health of women, especially relating to pregnancy.

The centre has around 3,000 client visits a year. It offers advice and signposting, donated clothing and equipment for babies and children, emergency food (710 bags last year), counselling and support around pregnancy choices and loss.

We are Family

The main activity of Alternatives is providing holistic support to vulnerable women and their families through the **We Are Family** programme. Around 25-30 families regularly attend the weekly Monday We Are Family (WAF) group meetings. A typical client has escaped an abusive relationship, has come to Alternatives when she is alone and pregnant in the UK, homeless and with no legal status.

Alternatives has rising numbers of clients at its We Are Family group, many have extreme needs and are incredibly vulnerable. They work with over 100 families a year, most of whom will have attended regularly every Monday and most with acute ongoing needs.

WAF provides parenting and life skills to help women with their baby, develop secure attachment and become a confident and loving parent. Life skills sessions help women grow in self-awareness and self-esteem, gaining the resilience to avoid abusive relationships and have positive aspirations for the future for their family. The Monday morning group has a crèche for the teaching sessions, healthy food, and a gift of baby wipes. Birthdays are celebrated, there are outings in the holidays and sessions where families play and learn together.

Mission Focus - Alternatives Trust

- Support workers visit vulnerable families at home to support with parenting and also helps address practical needs like health appointments, housing, advocacy and immigration paperwork.
- There are also practical parenting classes and growing social enterprises, including the WAF CAF and the WAF Charity Shop, to provide routes to employment through training and volunteering for mums as their children grow up. 32 women moved on last year.



Alternatives also provides secondary school lessons and youth club sessions on healthy relationships and other challenging areas for young people.

Please pray for:

- Wisdom for all the Alternatives staff as they work with parents and children.
- Safety for its families, often living precariously and with no security.
- All of the families to move forwards well, to get the basics in place of status, food, clothes and a safe place to sleep.
- Healing for those who come for counselling after trauma, abuse, loss and other painful issues.
- Mums with new babies especially K with twins, and others in vulnerable situations still expecting.
- Families where it takes years for paperwork to come through, despite a past of trafficking/prostitution etc., that these women will stay hopeful and children do not suffer.
- WAF Charity Shop at 66 Prince Regent Lane to develop, especially for staff and enough volunteers, and for its success.
- All volunteers to get on well together and to learn helpful skills for the future.
- The new WAF Youth group to develop healthy relationships together, and to equip them for overcoming bullying and to make good choices in their developing years.

Give thanks for:

- 25 years to date, new director Simone Thomas and the future ahead.
- Forrest House, for such an ideal place to work and to welcome clients.
- ♦ God's continual provision of their needs, especially when it is specific items for families.
- ♦ The staff team who all feel like they are a gift from God.
- ♦ Their friends and supporters who help make this all happen.

We also pray that St George's and St Giles' can continue to support this incredible charity, through donations of clothing and children's equipment, finance and time.
